



What does it mean to be a workplace on-site mentor?

A GHYW mentor is a responsible adult who is selected by the employer and serves as a trusted ally and guide for the student intern. S/he helps to ensure that the student develops important trade and life skills while learning about available opportunities and resources.

What are the mentor's commitments?

- Attend Orientation with student intern and GHYW staff.
- Be able to commit to spending at least one hour with the intern each time they are on-site.
- Spend time with the intern doing mutually agreed upon activities.
- Complete two intern evaluation forms (once during internship and second at the end).
- Communicate with the program coordinator via telephone or email if unable to be present during an intern visit.

What are the mentor's responsibilities?

- Serve as a positive role model by modeling desirable behaviors—e.g. patience, making meetings on-time, tolerance, and reflective listening.
- Be respectful of the intern's opinions and time.
- Encourage and support the intern throughout their experience.

What are the qualifications for becoming a mentor?

- Be 21 years of age.
- Have earned a high school diploma.
- Submit a WSP application and pass criminal background check.
